Course Description: (as notated in the GSE Catalog)

Education and Computers establishes a foundation for using the computer and technology in a variety of educational settings across all subject areas. The course is hands-on in nature, with focus on current trends. Additionally, learners can expect to discuss theory, practice and social/philosophical issues related to the use of computers in education. Some familiarity with computers is recommended; no prior computer skills are required.

Class Overview:

As an online course, students are expected to access the course daily to complete required assignments. The material covered in this course is practical and hands on. Students will explore a variety of online/web-based learning tools and work collaboratively with peers to explore how these tools can positively impact learning. Weekly class discussions, reflections, and projects will always be due on Wednesday and Sunday evenings.

Grading Scale:

Each assignment in this course will be graded out of a 4-point scale which includes:
