#### Participation (40 points)

We will all make our own choices as teachers. Our "classroom space" will be where we can explore and try out our ideas. In sharing the different possibilities we can teach and learn from each other. We are all expected to attend each class. Attendance is especially important in this course as it is designed to support and monitor your student teaching experience. If "Back to School" is scheduled during one of our class sessions, please provide proof from your school.

Because we share information from the field among ourselves, comments made in class are to be considered confidential.

### Dialogue Journal (20 points)

As part of your student teaching experience you are to keep a journal where you can reflect on your daily school experiences. You will also be asked to respond periodically to given prompts related to teaching. I will be collecting some of your journals at random during class. Please make sure that you have them ready. As part of your entries, you need to reflect on the evaluations received on the field, by both your cooperating teacher and your supervisor. You will be writing a two-page summary of your entries. **Due date: December 8**.

#### **Portfolios**

You will create a professional portfolio for use in the job market. The portfolio will include, at a minimum, a language teaching philosophy, thematic unit and resume. Please consider including additional items, such as material you create, lesson plans, your reflection paper, your language learning memoir, etc. We will be discussing this project further in class.

During your Student Teaching you will be collecting material that will help you create your Portfolio. For the Internship Seminar you will be required to turn in your Middle Phase Parent-Teacher Reflection, a Late Phase Lesson Plan, & a Late Phase Unit Plan. Start planning!

Academic Integrity: I expect that you will comply with standards of academic integrity (that is, you will not even think about cheating) in this course. If you need assistance in understanding an assignment or course content, please seek assistance from other appropriate resources or me. Assignments, however, should be your own work, except in cases where I have required a group product. The consequence for violating policies of academic integrity and other elements of the student code of conduct are serious and can have a tremendous negative impact on your academic progress and future career. You should not turn in the same work in two separate classes without the specific written approval of the faculty members involved. Leaving work until the last minute can increase the temptation to plagiarize work from journals or "borrow" friends' work. You can avoid problems by getting your work done early. You will explain your philosophy of teaching and your unit design.

Your presentation should have a warm up and a closure geared to your audience.
